A Message from Tim Mock and Barry Thomas

This past year has been a year of transition and improvement. We have been able to transition out of pandemic thinking and are able to look deeper at the current operations and the future. Occupancies in all levels of care have rebounded and are very strong. Our biggest challenge continues to be staffing levels. While some departments are near or at full employment, we continue to be in need of Housekeepers, LPNs and our biggest need being Certified Nurse Aides (CNAs). Therefore, we strategically developed a solution and began the process to train and educate CNAs. We have been officially approved to teach our own CNA Training Course, which the first class is scheduled to begin in October 2023. We hope through recruiting and training a new generation of nurse aides we can help meet our staffing needs and improve the availability of nurse aides throughout our region.

We continue to look at what is next for our campus. Currently we are planning to expand our townhomes. We are in presale mode, with the hope of having 8 of the 10 units sold prior to commencing construction. While the townhome project will fit on our original parcel, over the past several years we have been able to acquire 23 more acres of land adjacent to our campus. We will be working to use this land for the benefit of the campus and greater community in the years ahead.






Improving Outdoor Spaces

Each year our leadership picks a cause to advance projects important to Laurel View Village. Our 2021 Christmas appeal raised over \$10,000 along with a \$25,000 grant from Lee Initiatives to transform the outside area of our personal care center which was completed in 2023. This project was a huge success and our personal care residents couldn't be happier with the outcome! The small patio was formerly underutilized due to its size and lack of a roof. This meant the space became completely unusable when raining and sunny days presented a challenge as the space quickly became too hot. Providing a solid roof and doubling the size of the patio has made such a positive impact on the area and has increased resident participation rates by 15%, which improves both physical and mental health.


2022 Impact Awards

PROPERTY & SERVICES

Laurel View Village is located on a 46-acre campus in a rural part of the Laurel Highlands, Somerset County, Pennsylvania. The campus facilities provide a variety of senior living options with a total of 170 residential living units. The campus includes residential living in single level, duplex townhomes with garages; one three-story structure with under building parking and an attached community center; one two-story apartment structure that offers enclosed access to Laurel View Village's Personal Care and Health Care Centers; and two specialized areas for those with cognitive impairments. The main building includes the 67-unit Personal Care facility and 60-bed Skilled Nursing facility and includes two (2) specialized areas for individuals with cognitive impairments – known as Reflections and the Arbor. Laurel View Village also owns the Davidsville Care Center, a comprehensive outpatient health care center located on its campus, providing residents convenient access to primary care physicians, physical, speech and occupational therapy, and outpatient laboratory services. Within the main building, also includes a chapel, the Village Café, beauty and barber salon, and credit union. The Cambridge building is home to Fresh Harvest Restaurant, banquet rooms, and community center featuring a wellness center and lap pool. A licensed Home Care program is also available to help residents in their homes age in place.

New Townhome Expansion

We are excited to start another chapter with Laurel View Village

After many years of considering and a growing list of interest for townhomes, Laurel View Village is beginning the presale process for the potential of 5 duplexes adding ten new townhomes to campus.

The Laurel View Village board approved the presale of new townhomes based on the understanding that at least (8) eight townhomes to be sold before moving forward with the expansion. Each townhome features two car garages and larger square footage ranging from 1640 sq ft to 1776 sq ft.









